



The MSMVCD and the WMMCCC agree to substitute Agnique MMF with a product documented to have fewer potential adverse environmental impacts as soon as such an alternative with similar effectiveness is registered in the state of California.

In all situations requiring treatment with Bt, Bs or Agnique, the MSMVCD will work in partnership with West Marin communities and property owners/residents to correct the situations with physical and/or mechanical means of control so that treatment is not required repeatedly or on a chronic basis. Working with each property owner for a long-term non-chemical solution remains the MSMVCD top priority. Under the California Health & Safety Code, the property owner can be held responsible for correcting the situation that supports mosquito-breeding habitat.


The only exception to this agreement is if the MSMVCD, in conjunction with the Marin County Public Health Officer and California Department of Health Services-Vector Borne Diseases Section declares a state of emergency, based on response levels as outlined in the Arbovirus Surveillance Response Plan. Under the authority of the Mosquito Abatement Act of 2003 (Canciamilla, AB1454) any agreements with local jurisdictions will be null and void.


