Meeting of the Resident Permit Parking Plan Committee of the Board of Directors

AGENDA

1. Call to Order at 4:06 p.m.

2. Roll: all present.

3. Status of county's plan for development of parking ordinances:

Members discussed the June 8 meeting with Supervisor Rodoni and county staff. At this meeting, members of the committee shared the outcome of the poll of Brighton Avenue residents (on east side of the street) regarding a permit parking plan. The Department of Public Works also presented the draft report related to the survey they had done of parking spaces in downtown Bolinas. Their number for Brighton Avenue was 116. This information would affect the number of permits the Coastal Commission may allow. It was determined that the county could probably not ask for more than half of the available spaces. At the committee meeting some members expressed concern that if too many permits were requested that there may be some pushback from the Coastal Commission. In reality, not all residents potentially eligible for a permit would use them. Since it would only cover night use, day use access would not be affected. The committee plans to ask for a meeting with Sarah Jones, the Assistant Director of Community Development for her view on this matter as she would be the one to work on the application to the Commission.

At the June 8 meeting, Supervisor Rodoni indicated that the county is still strongly considering putting in place a vehicle length restriction of 22 feet, day and night and letting Measure X, the existing overnight ordinance expire. The rationale for this plan is that this new ordinance would enforceable. Where it would be applied and a host of other questions persist. Committee members expressed their concerns regarding this plan. If Measure X were to remain it most likely will need to include this length restriction, although there is no guarantee that the county will agree to this modification. Follow up is needed.

4. Enforcement concerns:

Members plan to ask the Marin County Sheriff's West County Area commander, Lt. Collins to a special meeting regarding enforcement concerns.

5. Approve Minutes of May 10, 2022 meeting. It was decided to add the charts detailing the outcomes from the "BCPUD Survey Brighton Ave, East – Responses 4.24.22 – 5.2.22 Poll of Permit Parking" to the official minutes so that they can be posted on the BCPUD website.
