Hi there,

I wanted to voice my support of the emergency housing project for the people currently occupying the Tacherra Ranch.

After seeing Suzy's cry for help and reading the report, I am heartbroken that there are people in our community who would oppose this project. I understand also, that most of the people in opposition are those who own their own homes. I am a renter, I am housing insecure, and yet I am fortunate to have a roof over my head, safe water to drink and sanitary bathroom facilities. This is a basic human need, and should be provided to the 50 people living at this property.

I also want to acknowledge the project proposed would be on precious wetlands, and that I am not completely informed of the impact this would have. Being in my late thirties, it is an unfortunate reality that my generation has inherited a multitude of climate problems from previous generations. I do respect and appreciate the elders of our town trying to preserve the wetlands. However, I think it is really important that we consider the wellbeing of the 50 people living in unsafe conditions, and ask ourselves as a community if, and I quote from an email sent by Dean Hart (who I'm sure is a homeowner) 'from a financial perspective, the cost of temporarily moving these folks out of the current illegal substandard conditions to other County housing closer to county services' really is the most humane treatment, or is rather a way to remove these people from their only home to some far off place where we don't have to look at it?

Again, I am in favor of the emergency permit for housing this community of people.
