# When are the Board meetings?

The Board of Directors is scheduled to meet monthly; regular meetings are usually held at 6:00 pm on the third Wednesday of the month at the Bolinas Fire Department Meeting Room (100 Mesa Road, Bolinas), and are open to public attendance, either in person or via Zoom.



The agenda for each meeting is finalized and published on the Friday immediately preceding the Wednesday meeting date; the agenda is available on the District website (www.bcpud.org), in the Bolinas Hearsay News, and on Nextdoor. If you would like to request an item to be added to the agenda, please contact us by the Thursday immediately preceding the meeting.

## What if I'm too busy to attend the meetings?

# Where does my water come from?

Bolinas sources its water from the Arroyo Hondo Creek. When needed, the District uses water stored in its two reservoirs, Woodrat 1 and Woodrat 2 (pictured above). In general, the BCPUD accesses water from the reservoirs for emergency purposes only, or when it is not possible for operational reasons to divert water directly from the Arroyo Hondo. The BCPUD treats raw water at the treatment plant on Mesa Road before it is sent to the water storage tanks and distributed to customers.

#### **Resource Recovery Hours and Rates**

Monday 9 - 4:30; Wednesday – Saturday 9 - 4:30; Tuesday and Sunday CLOSED Please note that the site may also be closed at other times due to inclement weather.

#### Current rates:

- Greenwaste (up to 2" diameter x 4' length) \$30.00 per cubic yard
- Greenwaste to be chipped (2" x 5') \$30.00 per cubic yard
- Uncut material over 5" diameter \$15.00 \$45.00 each (uncut eucalyptus NOT accepted)
- Pine & cypress rounds up to 15" diameter \$45.00 per cubic yard
- Eucalyptus & oak rounds up to 12" diameter \$60.00 per cubic yard
- Any round over 12" diameter \$75.00 per ½ cubic yard
- Woodchips (clean chips only) \$30.00 per cubic yard
  - o Chips with rounds, logs, or branches included will be charged extra

Prices may vary, depending on size and type of material. Compost pick-up is free. Resource Recovery does NOT accept palm trunks or leaves, fibrous trunks, flax roots, banana trunks, mattress vine, bamboo, dirt, fence posts or lumber. Absolutely NO food or garbage!

#### **Green Bin Materials**

Use your green compost bin to dispose of food scraps, soiled paper, paper bags, and plant materials. **Do not place** compostable material in plastic or compostable plastic bags; the current regional compost facilities are unable to process those materials. ### **Tank Site Pipeline Replacement Project Complete**

The town's potable water is held in two storage tanks, roughly 430,000 gallons each. The East Tank was updated a few years ago with seismic retrofitting among other improvements. Before beginning the West Tank rehabilitation project, the District discovered that the valves and piping connecting the two tanks required upgrading. The tank site pipeline replacement project began late September and was completed at the end of January. During the project, the District had to rely on the East Tank alone. Now that the project is finished, the town is drawing water from both tanks again, with a new flowmeter installed that provides accurate, real-time consumption data.





#### New Treatment Plant at Mesa Park

You may have noticed the fencing and water tanks in the parking lot at Mesa Park, and wondered, "What's going on here?!" This area is the District's new emergency drought well water treatment site. The BCPUD is responsible for identifying emergency water sources to supplement our distribution system during water shortages. There is an existing well at the Resource Recovery site; the BCPUD is currently constructing a treatment plant at Mesa Park for UV treatment and chlorination of well water in case of emergency drought conditions.
